European Review

- EGB – as an important factor (Value Management)
- The number of value analysers is low in Europe
- New trends, new developments (MoV)
- Development of the EN standard (CEN TC/279)
 - distinction, competitive edge



The Training System in Hungary

- A value-analysing, training system of high level has been established in Hungary. 👍
- More than 2,000 persons acquired an AVS qualification during 15 years.
- Universities – play a leading role
- 90% of the AVS qualifications are acquired at universities.
- The number of professors with a CVS qualification decreases 😞😞😞

The Development of the Training Network



- It is a basic principle that only a specialist having a CVS qualification may be granted the rights related to training.
- Preservation, development of the training bases established in the tertiary education institutions.
- Involvement of new professors.
 - Bringing the university teachers having a Master's degree into a good position

Quo Vadis AVS 2013?

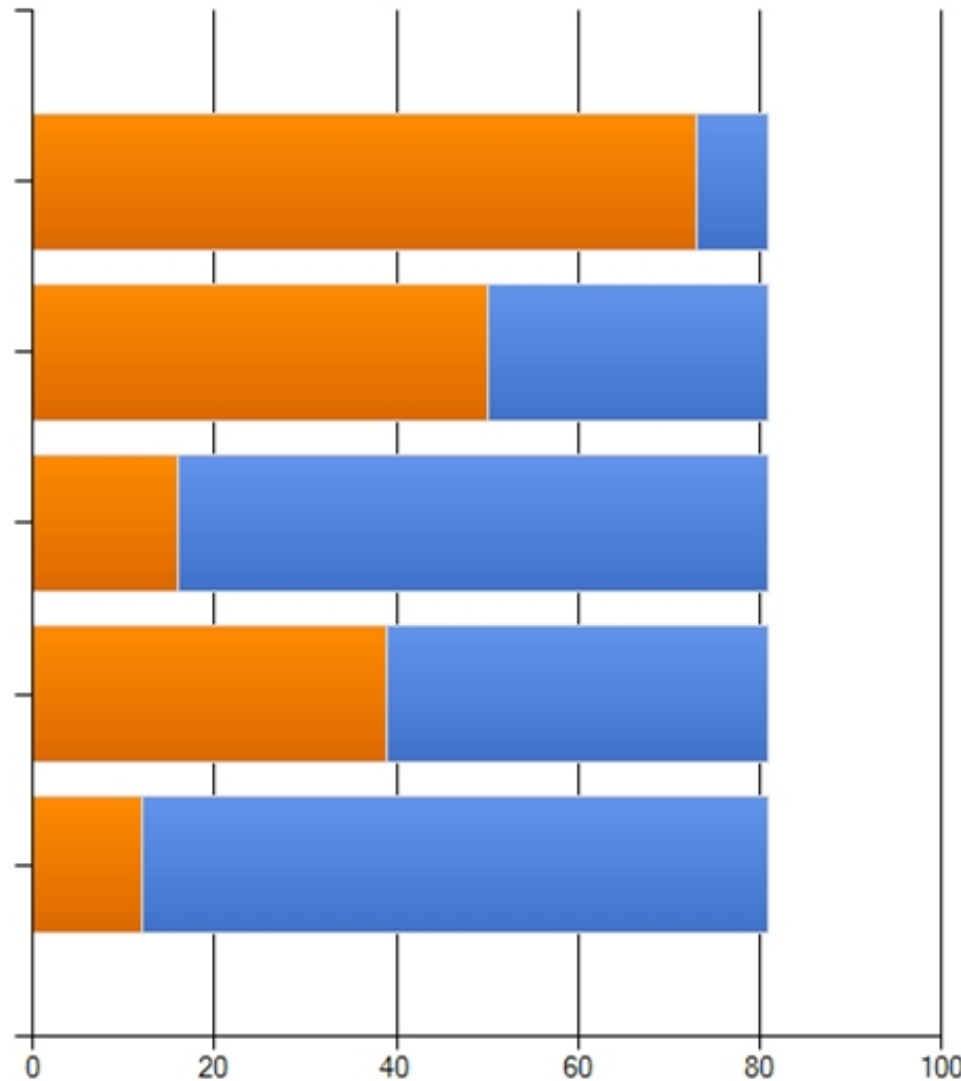
- „Quo Vadis AVS 2013” research program.

A sponsorship system has to be establishes

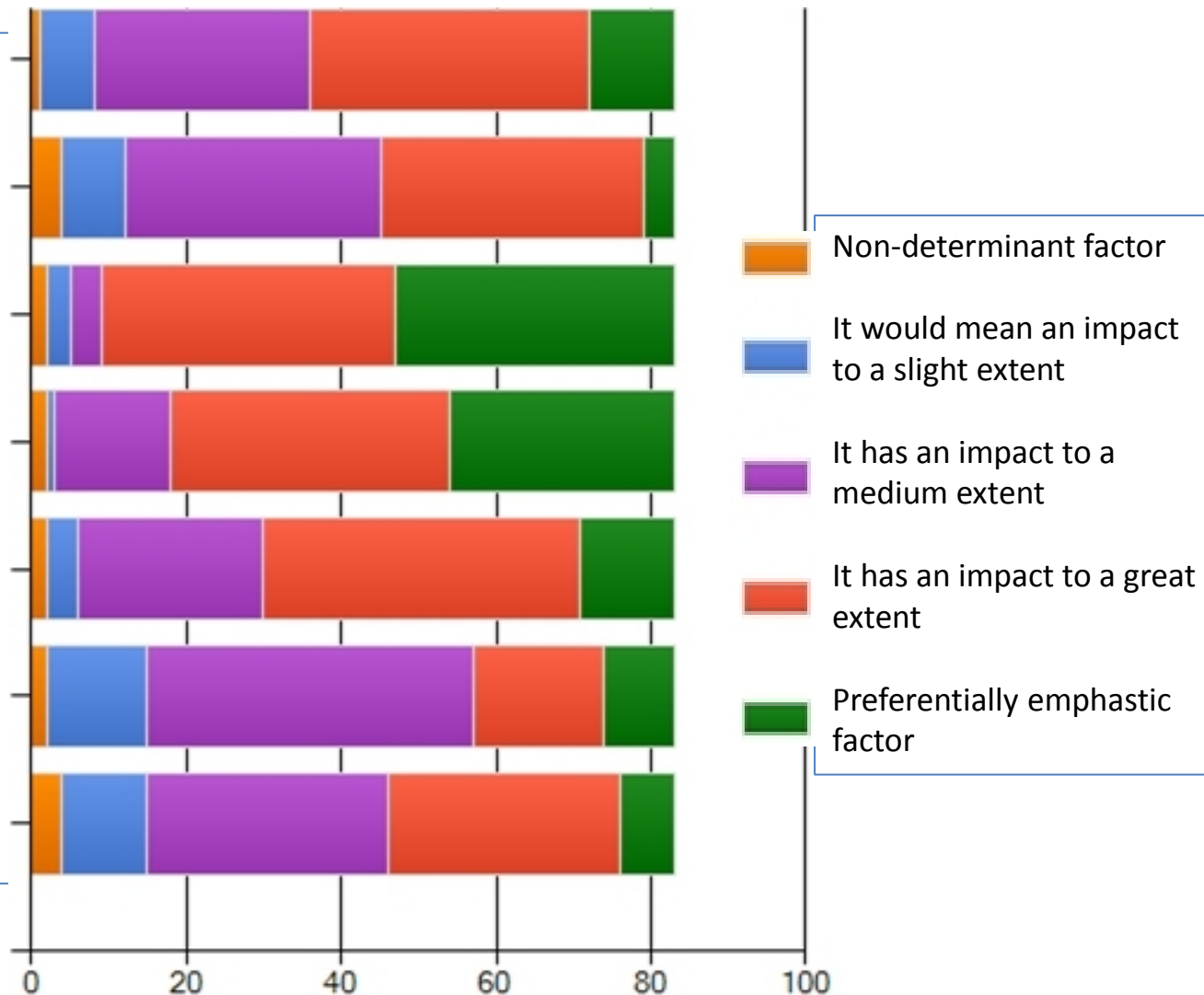
More „sharp” projects have to be looked into

New Challenges

- The operation of the trainings, qualifications
 - Support for maintenance of the qualifications
- Development of the AVS mentoring system
 - Supporting of acquisition of a higher degree of qualification
 - Generating VE projects
- Development of university trainings
 - Preparation of the entry points for the new professors



Synergies - Sustainability

- Catalysation of the establishment of new civil (professional) organisations in the European countries
 - In other countries, generating VE activity after seeing the Hungarian successes
- The system of public trainings (SHVA)
 - Practical examples, case studies
- International conference (Budapest , 20-21/04/2015)
 - As is to be expected: Governmental, IT, GE, Automotive, Central-Eastern European Universities, Value Management sections.
 - The objective is the participation of 25 countries.
